

# The History of Shekinah-Fernwood Lodge No. 246

PHILADELPHIA LODGE NO. 72  
CONSTITUTED JANUARY 14, 1797

In order to understand the history of Shekinah – Fernwood Lodge No. 246 as it exists today, we need to look at the history of the main lodges that have joined throughout the years to make up the fabric of the wonderful lodge we know today. It started back on Saint John's day in 1796 where, at the Quaker Meeting House on 5th and Mulberry (Arch) Streets, the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania was holding its Annual Communication and received a petition from a number of brethren residing in the city of Philadelphia, who had just separated from Lodge No. 67 and praying that a Warrant be granted them for holding a Lodge in Philadelphia and that Brother Andrew Baum be constituted its first Master. Whereupon, on the motion made and seconded, it was agreed that the prayer of said petition be granted and a Warrant made out naming it Philadelphia Lodge No. 72.

One of the first public ceremonies in which Philadelphia Lodge No. 72 participated was that commemorating the death of President and Brother George Washington, held on December 26, 1799, twelve days after his death. After listening to a speech given by their Grand Master on Washington as a Freemason, the members set out, aprons trimmed in black, with their brethren to join the parade.

INDUSTRY LODGE NO. 131  
CONSTITUTED JUNE 22, 1811

In the early part of the year 1811 some of the members of Lodge No. 19 conceived the idea to form a new lodge, the result being that Industry Lodge No. 131 was constituted on the 22nd day of June, 1811 because of a petition filed with the Grand Lodge by 19 gentlemen praying for a warrant to be issued to the petitioners who stated that they were regular master masons belonging to Lodge No. 19 meeting in Philadelphia under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. This petition is in good condition and is filed in the office of the Grand Secretary.

The petition was received by the Grand Lodge on Saturday the 22nd day of June 1811 and being found in due form and being in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Grand Lodge, the prayer of the petitioners was granted and the Grand Secretary was directed to make out a warrant and that the same be number 131 which was according to the minutes, after a short space of time completed and read and the Worshipful Master Wardens named in the same, and the other officers elect, were installed into the respective office and the Lodge, fully constituted in ancient and solemn form by the name of Industry, Lodge No. 131.

The first stated meeting of the Lodge was held on July 1, 1811, at 7:30. At this meeting, the business consisted of the presentation of three petitions of parties praying to be initiated, also petitions, asking to be appointed Tyler of the lodge and resolutions for appointing committees to prepare the necessary bylaws and to procure the necessary property and implements so that the business of the lodge might be properly conducted.

The first meeting place on Filbert Street was a three-story brick building with three windows on the first and second floors with shutters and three windows on the third floor without shutters. It was in its day, a handsome building of the colonial style of architecture.

It appears by the minutes that the meeting on September 18, 1811, was held at the new hall of the Grand Lodge in Chestnut Street, west of Seventh Street. After the fire in 1819, the Lodge moved back to the Filbert Street hall, and in 1820, after the repairs, back to Chestnut Street again.

Due to the anti-Masonic movement as a result of the Morgan Affair and the dwindling number of Masons attending the meeting, the Lodge surrendered its Warrant on June 5, 1837. On September 22, 1852, of the Grand Lodge restored the Warrant to the members of Industry Lodge. Industry Lodge continued until 1991 when it merged with Philadelphia Potter Lodge No. 72.

## SHEKINAH LODGE NO. 246 CONSTITUTED AUGUST 5, 1850

Just over 50 years after the founding of Philadelphia Lodge No. 72, on the evening of August 5, 1850, the Right Worshipful Grand Master, William Whitney along with the members of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, met at Commissioners Hall, Frankford Road and Master Street, Philadelphia, when the following named petitioners being present: Brothers Henry S. Patterson, William H. Witte, John G. Michner and a few others were duly qualified and constituted a lodge under the name Shekinah Lodge No. 246, where Brother Henry S. Patterson was installed as Master. The membership numbered eleven by the end of December 1850. From that time on, the Lodge grew year by year until there were 420 members in 1900. The Lodge moved to 506 North Second Street in 1851. On June 27, 1854, the first meeting was held at the South Third Street Hall, known as Washington Hall. The

Lodge met here until September of 1855, when the New Masonic Hall was dedicated (September 26, 1855), being situated on Chestnut Street. Shekinah Lodge No. 246 participated in the dedication ceremonies.

In 1861, refreshments given by the Lodge were discontinued until the end of the year, to enable the Lodge to dispense charity more liberally. This, along with the Lodge also giving charity to the widows in the form of turkeys for Thanksgiving, are just a few examples of how the Lodge has given liberally over the years.

On October 20, 1873, the first meeting of the Lodge in the new Masonic Temple, Broad and Filbert Streets, was held. The very next year, on June 13, the Right Worshipful Grand Master, Alfred R. Potter, was received with honors into the Lodge. (This is a significant visit as the Lodge named in his honor, Potter Lodge No. 441, would eventually merge with Philadelphia Lodge and then become a part of Shekinah Lodge No. 246.)

### **POTTER LODGE NO. 441 CONSTITUTED JANUARY 13, 1869**

On May 30, 1869, thirty-one members of Philadelphia Lodge No. 72, understood that Freemasonry was growing in Philadelphia and staked their membership on it by tendering their resignations for the purpose of uniting together in an application to the Right Worshipful Grand Lodge for a charter to form a new lodge in the city of Philadelphia. The application being in due form, a day shy of the seventy-second anniversary of their mother lodge being formed, Potter Lodge No. 441, named after Past Grand Master Alfred Potter, was constituted on January 13, 1869.

During its first meeting, as a token of affection, Philadelphia Lodge No. 72 presented a check to pay for the regalia for Potter Lodge No. 441. Potter Lodge met at the Grand Lodge Building in Philadelphia and thrived until its merger with its original lodge Philadelphia Lodge No. 72, to create Philadelphia – Potter Lodge No. 72 in 1985.

### **SAINT PAUL LODGE NO. 481 CONSTITUTED JANUARY 1, 1870**

Saint Paul's Lodge No. 481 was constituted by the Right Worshipful Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on New Year's Day of 1870. We do not have much about the founding and history of this lodge. We know that it merged into Philadelphia Lodge No. 72 in 1967.

## FERNWOOD LODGE NO. 543

### CONSTITUTED DECEMBER 9, 1875

In the year 1875, a number of brethren gathered to discuss the formation of a new Masonic lodge in the Delaware County area just west of Philadelphia, known as Fernwood. As a result of that gathering, a petition was presented to the Grand Lodge at its Stated Meeting held December 1, 1875.

The petition was referred to the Grand Officers with power to act, and at a meeting of those officers shortly after, the Charter was granted to sixteen brethren giving power to open a new Lodge and to make Masons, under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. The officers named in the petition were:

Brother Oliver B. Moss, for Worshipful Master,  
Brother Oscar R. Graham, for Senior Warden,  
Brother Samuel A. Ferrell, for Junior Warden.

The brethren named in the warrant came from varied walks of life. Brothers Moss, Hoffner, McKinney, Matchett and Ferrell were identified with the building trades in and around South and West Philadelphia. Brother Graham represented the Singer Sewing Machine Company in Philadelphia. Brother Schofield was a painter in South Philadelphia and Brother Pike was a dentist from the same section. Brothers Clegg and Beatty were connected with Callaghan's Mills, the former as secretary to the owner, the latter as a foreman in one of its departments.

Brother John H. Riley was an awning maker and one of the active members at the meetings. Brother Crompton was a paper box manufacturer and was the founder of a firm which was still in business when the Lodge celebrated its Fiftieth Anniversary in 1925.

Brother Swindells was a Methodist minister, and Brother McLean was manager of the Baptist Publication Society in Philadelphia, while Brother Bardsley kept a bookstore at the corner of Sixth and Jayne Streets in the city.

The petition was recommended by George W. Bartram Lodge No. 298, and by Brother William Kelly, Past Master of Lodge No. 59, afterwards Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania in 1898-99; also by Brother William B. Heck of Lodge No. 419, and Brothers Charles E. Meyer and Harry G. Clark of Lodge No. 158.

The new Lodge was constituted by the Grand Lodge in the schoolroom on the second floor of the schoolhouse located on Fourth Street in Fernwood on December 9, 1875.

The following Grand Officers were present:

Brother Alfred Potter, Right Worshipful Grand Master,  
Brother Robert Clark, Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master,  
Brother James M. Porter, Right Worshipful Senior Grand Warden,



Brother Michael Nisbett, Right Worshipful Junior Grand Warden.  
Brother Thomas R. Patton, Right Worshipful Grand Treasurer,  
Brother John Thomson, Right Worshipful Grand Secretary.

At the first meeting of the Lodge, held on December 10, 1875, the following Officers were elected to serve one year:

Brother Oliver B. Moss, Worshipful Master  
Brother Oscar R. Graham, Senior Warden  
Brother Samuel A. Ferrell, Junior Warden  
Brother Henry M. Hoffner, Treasurer  
Brother George W. Shirley, Secretary

Four petitions for initiation and membership and four for membership were received at this meeting. Soon realizing that the schoolroom was not adapted to Masonic work and in view of the fact it was the only public building in Fernwood at that time, a number of the brethren suggested that a new structure be erected to serve as a meeting place.

The "Fernwood Masonic Hall Association" was organized and stock issued to provide funds for the building of the proposed structure. This stock was not only subscribed to by the members of the Lodge, but also by citizens of the community who were interested in the undertaking.

The building was constructed on Baltimore Avenue at the corner of Church Lane and the first meeting in the new building was held on December 1, 1876. For a period of twenty-one years, the Lodge held its meetings here until it was destroyed by fire on February 26, 1898. All the paraphernalia, furniture and the Lodge Warrant were lost. The records, which were at the home of the Secretary, were saved and are still in existence. At the time the Hall was destroyed, Brother William J. Kelly was Right Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Pennsylvania. Application was made to him for a new Warrant and for permission to move the Lodge to the Masonic Temple, Philadelphia, where the Lodge held its meetings until they merged with Shekinah Lodge No. 246 in 2014, creating Shekinah-Fernwood Lodge No. 246.



## A Luminous Tribute to Masonic Leadership



As part of the Grand Ballroom's historic renovation at the Masonic Temple in Philadelphia in 2016, Philadelphia-Potter Lodge No. 72 proudly funded the creation of a stained-glass window honoring Brother Andrew Jackson, seventh President of the United States and a member of Greenville Lodge No. 119 in Greenville, Tennessee. His likeness—depicted second from the left among four Masonic Presidents—stands as a luminous tribute to the enduring bond between Masonic values and American leadership. Brother Jackson is one of fourteen U.S. Presidents known to have been Freemasons, each reflecting the fraternity's legacy of civic service and principled stewardship.



## The Bond



Standing proudly outside the majestic Masonic Temple at One North Broad Street in Philadelphia, the sculpture ***"The Bond"*** sculpted by James West, captures a moment of profound fraternal symbolism: Benjamin Franklin presenting a Masonic apron to George Washington.

This striking bronze sculpture, gifted by Shekinah-Fernwood Lodge No. 246 on June 3, 2017, honors the enduring values of brotherhood, leadership, and legacy that unite Freemasons across generations. As two of America's most revered Founding Fathers—and devoted Freemasons—Franklin and Washington embody the principles of integrity, charity, and civic virtue. Their shared commitment to the Craft helped shape the moral foundation of a new nation.

By commissioning and gifting ***"The Bond"***, Shekinah-Fernwood Lodge affirmed its dedication to preserving Masonic heritage and inspiring future generations. The statue stands not only as a tribute to two great men, but as a testament to the Lodge's own legacy of service, symbolism, and celebration.






